<b>Subject goal</b> Qualifying for understanding the situation regarding taking and execution of international treaties in the field of the environment, for the implementation of elements of international environmental law, as well as the contribution of the Republic of Serbia to its development in order to protect short-term and long-term oriented ecological interest. Special attention is paid to international multilateral treaties in the field of the environment in modern countries in the accession process.		
<b>Subject outcome</b> Ability to protect the inalienable human right to a healthy environment as well as their own environment by working on the development and implementation of elements of international environmental law, on two levels: - in the development of high-quality ecological legal relationship to the subjects of international law, as well as all subjects of international environmental law (states, legal entities and individuals); -at the level of the Republic of Serbia, particularly through the introduction and application of those elements that we take into our legislation through confirmation (ratification) .Students are trained to analyze complex issues related to management of the adaptation to climate change in the context of sustainable economic development.		
<b>Subject content</b> <i>Theoretical classes</i> Studying the formation of permanent roads and ad hoc bodies, as well as the organization, necessary for the beginning of creation of elements of international environmental law. The study of international organizations relevant to the legal treatment of environmental values and relationships. The study of the principles of international environmental law. Series of hours dedicated to the study of the important elements of international environmental law, and especially on the nature of R. Serbia (analysis of the most important elements of international environmental law includes a knowledge transfer of more than 60 Convention, a series of annexes, as a number of protocols. Series of classes devoted to the study of documents of international environmental law that in the future could be significant for Serbia, for which reason they can be ratified (close to 20 conventions). Lectures concerning roads, ways and levels of implementation of international environmental law in domestic legal reality. <i>Practical classes</i> Workshop with a thematic treatment of certain international conventions in the field of the environment, in particular the Basel Convention, the Aarhus and the other with transboundary environmental issues.
